During my year as board chair I have been reminded that United Way of Hancock County is more than a fundraiser. We don't wait passively for a problem to address. We aren't afraid to take on the toughest challenges. United Way of Hancock County staff and board believe that together we can accomplish far more than any individual or single organization could alone. It's what we like to call "living united." Today more than ever, when the challenges we face can seem overwhelming,



it is important to recognize that great things happen when we focus our collective energy on the issues that matter most.

As United Way's board chair, I appreciate the board's willingness to fund this program. I also greatly appreciate the partnership with the Community Foundation as they fund this program with us.

I also want to express my gratitude to the 31 community volunteers who put in countless hours reviewing grants. I am amazed at the amount of thought and background research that goes into granting the funds to programs that show effectiveness and efficiency. Their work makes me proud to be part of an organization that impacts so many people.

TRENKAMP SELECTED AS SECOR SCHOLAR

United Way of Hancock County's Secor scholarship committee has announced the selection of Jordan Trenkamp, a senior at Van Buren school, as this year's United Way Foundation Secor Scholar. The \$2,000 renewable Secor Scholarship was established as a memorial to the Steven and Doris Secor bequest.

Trenkamp, the daughter of Doug and Kris Trenkamp, was selected because of her volunteerism, academic accomplishments, involvement in extracurricular and school activities and her ability to exemplify leadership skills.

"Jordan has given her time to Gliding Stars for the last 6 years. She decided she wanted to be a coach, but did not want to be paid. This action shows that Jordan is dedicated to our program and is not interested in any personal gain," said, Cindy Bregel, executive director of Gliding Stars, an adaptive ice skating program for individuals with disabilities.

Alyssa Brown, director of youth ministries at St. Michael Church, said, "Jordan has been deeply engaged with the youth program at St. Michael Parish specifically through the youth board. Every other week, she dedicates an additional two to three hours to the various youth ministry programs."

Trenkamp's service oriented involvement additionally includes volunteering with Silver Blades Figure Skating club, the ENGAGE Youth Council, St. Michael's Belize Outreach program, St. Michael's music ministries and more.

In her Secor application, Trenkamp wrote, "Volunteerism and service to me is happiness. Life is a classroom and adaptable to comply with anyone's liking. The path of life sets its course to teach someone and build happy memories along the way. The two biggest parts of my path that have had this effect on me have been volunteer work and service, which go hand in hand."

PADULA SELECTED AS DISTINGUISHED VOLUNTEER

United Way of Hancock County has selected Michael "Chick" Padula Jr. as this year's recipient of the Jeri Bjorling Memorial Distinguished Volunteer Award.

Padula is retired from Cooper Tire and Rubber Company where he served his 24-year career in many positions including: production engineer, electrician, plant engineer, staff engineer, special assignments engineer and plant assistant human resource manager. He is currently the president of the Findlay Area Human Resource Association (FAHRA). He has an



associate's degree of applied science in electronic technology, a bachelor's degree in industrial technology and a master's degree in business. He has taught human resources and organizational development classes at Owens Community College, the University of Findlay and Tiffin University.

Padula's selection is due to his ongoing volunteer activities for United Way of Hancock County as well as many other community organizations. Prior to his retirement, he led internal United Way fundraising efforts at Cooper Tire while serving on the education, health and financial stability impact teams for United Way. Impact teams evaluate grant requests and make recommendations for the distribution of funds to local nonprofit organizations. While retired, he continues to chair one of the two education impact teams. He is also a member of the transportation coalition and the Raise the Bar Hancock County high school/post-secondary committee.

Padula says that volunteering for Special Needs Day is his favorite volunteer opportunity. During the event, he helps the children go fishing. He has also been a volunteer for Car Tunes on Main since its inception in 2007. Some of the events he has volunteered for include: United Way's Days of Caring, Open Arms' Walk a Mile in Her Shoes, Susan G. Komen Race for the Cure, Coats for Christmas, 1 Matters Hancock County, and the Hancock County Home Builders Association annual golf outing. He also volunteers for The Arts Partnership, Habitat for Humanity and was on the Halloween parade committee for five years.

Padula is a 2012 Hancock Leadership graduate, a 2013 Government Leadership graduate and serves as a poll worker in Hancock County.

2016 NONPROFIT LEADER OF THE YEAR



United Way of Hancock County awarded the Nonprofit Leader Award for the first time in 2015 during the Chamber of Commerce's Small Business Awards ceremony. Nominations were taken from the community and a committee from the Chamber of Commerce reviewed and selected an individual who best represents the nonprofit community in leadership, dedication to their respective field, community collaboration and vision.

This year the award was presented to Brent Finlay, CEO of the Findlay Family YMCA. Finlay has been in the position of CEO at the YMCA since December of 2012. He is a member of the Findlay Rotary Club and serves on the board of the Findlay Hancock County Chamber of Commerce and Hancock Youth Soccer Association. Finlay is a certified National YMCA Organizational Leader and is a staff

development trainer for the YMCA of USA movement. He attended the University of North Dakota and University of Idaho majoring in exercise science and education. He also completed his MBA degree in business management.

During his tenure in Findlay, Finlay has shown a consistent ability and willingness to work closely with community partners as he serves the community through his role at the Findlay Family YMCA.

COLLABORATIVE PROGRAMS OF 2016

UNITED WE FIGHT.

WE FIGHT FOR FINANCIAL STABILITY.

We win by partnering with HHWP Community Action Commission, Ohio Benefit Bank, and Volunteers in Tax Assistance (VITA) to provide our residents with free tax preparation services. Our goal is to ensure residents receive qualifying tax credits at no cost creating the opportunity to achieve or maintain financial stability. This outcome also increases local spending in Hancock County. The stats: 2,023 tax returns completed, federal refunds received \$2,420,359.

WE FIGHT FOR ACCESS TO PRESCRIPTION MEDICINE.

We win by promoting the FamilyWize prescription card program. There are friends and neighbors with ongoing health challenges who are often confronted with choosing between a much-needed prescription or buying food. This program can reduce prescription costs from 40-70% on certain medications. The free FamilyWize card is available at local nonprofits and can be used with any insurance card. You can also download the smart phone app and have it with you at all times. Visit Familywize.org to view the 60,000 cooperating pharmacies and the medication listings. The stats: \$29,421 in savings for Hancock County families in 2016.

WE FIGHT FOR INFORMATION AND RESOURCES.

We win by providing a staffed information and referral service to address the needs of Hancock County residents. By dialing 2-1-1, callers seeking assistance will be connected to a live specialist available 24/7, 365 days a year. The specialist recommends resources and provides detailed information such as hours of service, and required documentation for local, state and federal assistance where applicable. 2-1-1 also provides special assignments such as scheduling appointments, including tax preparation. We are here for you, in one call with one helpful voice, by dialing 2-1-1.

WE ARE HAND-RAISERS.

We win by recruiting more than 1,000 volunteers to team up and complete projects for local nonprofits. Days of Caring is a week long collaborative event between public and private sectors. Major corporations and small businesses allow employees to work with an agency for a four-hour period to tackle much needed maintenance or special projects. This saves the organization time, energy, and money allowing their efforts to remain focused on serving Hancock County clients. The stats for 2016: 1,129 volunteers, 202 teams, assisting 40 organizations, saving organizations \$106,397.

WE BREAK BARRIERS AND LIFT BOUNDARIES.

We win when we lift limitations and join spirit with our special needs children and youth. We LIVE UNITED and support Boy Scouts during its one day camp for special needs children and youth in Hancock County. In September, 195 youth were paired with volunteers and staff from United Way, Marathon Petroleum Corporation, Blanchard Valley Health System and Awakening Minds Art to experience Camp Berry at its finest. This day provides barrier-breaking activities such as fishing, crafts, archery, canoeing, wall climbing, archery and more.

UNITED WAY IS NOT ONLY A FUNDRAISER. We don't wait passively for a problem to address. We aren't afraid to take on the toughest challenges. We won't approach you with vague requests and undefined causes, and we won't give up when the going gets tough.

WE FIGHT FOR EFFICIENT WAYS TO FEED HUNGRY FAMILIES.

Surveys performed by the Halt Hunger Initiative at Hancock County food pantries revealed the most needed food items are protein-based foods. As a Halt Hunger Initiative advisory board member and grain manager for Legacy

UNITED WE WIN.

Farmers Cooperative, Mitch Welty saw an opportunity to meet the local need for protein while engaging youth involved in the Hancock County Junior Livestock Auction. In 2016, we were able to provide nearly two tons of turkey, freezer beef and pork to local food pantries. Started in

2014, the effort has provided approximately 8,000 pounds of fresh meat to local families. Donors for the 2016 livestock auction were:

GRANTS AWARDED IN

2016

A full listing of grants provided out of funds raised by the 2015 United Way campaign is as follows:

Boy Scouts of America, Black Swamp Council was awarded \$47,500 for two programs: Boy Scouting program which promotes positive youth development that has a lasting impact on youth into young adulthood and throughout their life; and Exploring, which includes preparing young people to make ethical and moral choices over their lifetimes and explore career opportunities. An additional \$5,000 has been set aside to reimburse the organization for assisting boys who want to participate in Boy Scouts but do not have the financial resources to do so.

Camp Fire of Northwest Ohio was awarded \$60,000 for their Thrive program, a research-based, measurable approach to youth development. An additional \$60,000 has been set aside as a challenge grant to this organization and could be awarded if they meet established recommendations set forth by the community solutions committee.

Cancer Patient Services was awarded \$130,000 for its Patient Direct Services program providing medical supplies, nutritional supplements, emotional support and education to cancer patients.

CASA/GAL of Hancock County was awarded \$120,000 for its advocacy program which recruits, trains and supports volunteer Court Appointed Special Advocates as they represent children who are abused, neglected or dependent or are involved in domestic relations disputes.

The Center for Safe and Healthy Children was awarded \$26,000 for their forensic interview and examination program for abused children. The program provides a safe and caring place utilized by professionals who investigate child abuse allegations and guide these children and their families through the legal and healing process in the least traumatic way.

Century Health was awarded \$55,000 for its Peer-to-Peer program, a recovery focused direct service provided by Peer Support Specialists trained to advocate and support others struggling with mental illness and addiction recovery.

Challenged Champions Equestrian Center was awarded \$35,000 for its therapeutic riding program supporting residents of Hancock County with special needs, from early childhood to adulthood, and veterans with post-traumatic stress disorder through horseback riding and other horse related activities that promote physical, emotional and mental developments.

Children's Mentoring Connection was awarded \$102,000 for its Mentoring Youth at Risk program which recruits and screens adult volunteers to serve as mentors to children.

Findlay Family YMCA was awarded \$91,000 for two programs: the Open Door Membership program which makes services accessible to low-income families while still requiring a financial contribution, allowing the family to take ownership and regard themselves as a contributing member to the YMCA and community; and the child care program which provides educational, social and physical development while also assisting low-income families with child care expenses.

Family Resource Center was awarded \$131,490 for three programs: Bright Beginnings which focuses on early childhood programming; Community Prevention which focuses on tobacco, substance and alcohol abuse prevention; and Hancock Addiction Prevention Program for Youth (HAPPY), a peer-to-peer prevention program.

Findlay Hope House for the Homeless was awarded \$265,000 for four programs: the Housing Office, providing housing assistance and community referrals to low-income people; Independence Project which moves homeless families into permanent, affordable housing and out of poverty; Hope House Shelter, providing transitional housing to women and women with children; and Bridges Out of Poverty, a multi-faceted initiative focused on assisting people in generational poverty to be prosperous and communities to remain sustainable.

Girl Scouts of Western Ohio was awarded \$57,000 for the Personal and Professional Development program which promotes girls' personal growth and leadership development through a coordinated, progressive series of activities and experiences that help them become socially, morally, emotionally, physically and cognitively competent.

Hancock County Saves was awarded \$25,000 to provide programs to promote and increase saving and debt reduction to produce financial stability among individuals and families through education and awareness.

GRANTS AWARDED IN 2016 (CONTINUED)

HHWP Community Action Commission was awarded \$242,151 for Hancock Area Transportation Services (HATS), a public transportation program taking people to work, health appointments and more.

Kidney Foundation of Northwest Ohio was awarded \$9,000 for the Patient Direct Services and Education program in Hancock County.

Open Arms Domestic Violence & Rape Crisis Services was awarded \$300,000 for three programs: Adult Services, providing immediate shelter for persons fleeing from violence; Child Services which includes screening for abuse, conducting support groups for children and providing supervised visits; and Violence Recovery, a program for offenders focused on taking responsibility and changing behavior.

In addition to the above grants, a memorandum of understanding has been entered into with the American Red Cross to reimburse services related to disaster relief and armed forces communications up to \$37,500 for the year.

The total approved for agency programs and services was \$1,712,311. Investor's choice dollars totaled \$223,988 this year. Designations to other United Ways totaled \$120,206. The board also earmarked \$200,000 for the Halt Hunger Initiative, which provides funding for local food pantries and programs addressing food insecurity. Funds have also been earmarked for the community's collective impact work, including the following projects: workforce coalition's Raise the Bar-Hancock County director at \$30,000; Hancock County prekindergarten scholarships at \$145,000; and a community assessment at \$5,000. Also, \$188,388 has been placed in restricted reserves for initiative programs not yet finalized. Additional funds raised cover pledges that are uncollectable, board reserves and operating costs.

OUR IMPACT TEAM MEMBERS

The dollars raised during the annual fundraising efforts are distributed to approved programs and services through grant requests. The task of reviewing the grants is undertaken by local citizens who serve on the volunteer impact teams during the 2017 grant cycle. Thank you for the many hours you have given to this important undertaking.

HALT HUNGER INITIATIVE



The most recent survey from Feeding America's Map the Meal gap is telling us that one out of nearly eight individuals in Hancock County are identified as food insecure. This is an improvement from our 2012 ratio of one out of every six. We welcome the improvement. However, for that one person who is not at the table, the struggle is real. To ensure individuals and families have access to supplemental meals, the Halt Hunger Initiative funding stream continues to support the following agencies in their efforts to address the needs of the food insecure in Hancock County: Lutheran Social Services Choice Food Pantry; Christian Clearing House's Caring Cupboard food voucher program, Salvation Army's Emergency Food Pantry; West Ohio Food Bank's Food Distribution service and Cancer Patient Services Supplemental Food Program.

As the food security coalition continues applying Civic Lab's coalition building process, its challenge is to provide access to resources to elevate and empower Hancock County households to be food secure.

The latest research on childhood obesity underscores the measurable progress in communities where United Way and others are bringing people and organizations together to advance youth health.

second year of the On the Ball to Better Health program. Students were issued a 55-centimeter exercise ball along with an exercise and nutrition booklet and journal. For six weeks, students were challenged to exercise at least 20 minutes a day with or without their exercise ball and record their healthy choices. In order for proper completion, parents or caregivers were required to sign the students' journal on a bi-weekly basis. Special educators from Hancock Public Health and the Hancock County Ohio State Extension office were invited into the classroom to share extra tips on how to establish habits for a healthy lifestyle. Upon completion of the six-week program students submitted essays expressing what they learned during the program.

Many of the comments this year included a recognition of the importance of eating the right food and an awareness of better food choices and proper portion size. Congratulations to Darius on his hard work and determination to be "On the Ball to Better Health."
