FROM OUR CEO



Welcome to our 2017 Annual Report. It has been an exciting yet challenging year of transition.

Our 2017 fundraising effort has once again broken a record by raising 3.3 million! Thank you to all in Findlay and Hancock County who are so generous in many ways. 2017 also provided our United Way, and our community, with some remarkable instruments to support our desire to make major change happen.

Over the past four years United Way and community partners have been gathering data and working together to address our community needs through "Collective Impact." This process is a proven, more effective framework for solving complex social issues. It allows us to get to the root causes of the critical issues in our county. It is a system that requires organizations to reach outside of their comfort zones, trust each other and build a common agenda while sharing data, resources and goals. It also helps us to reduce or eliminate duplication of services.

United Way Worldwide, along with local United Ways, has developed the ALICE report. ALICE is a United Way acronym that stands for Asset Limited, Income Constrained, Employed. ALICE could be your child care worker, your parent on Social Security, the cashier at your supermarket, or a manufacturing associate. ALICE cannot always pay the bills, has little or nothing in savings, and is forced to make tough choices such as deciding between quality childcare or paying the rent. One unexpected car repair or medical bill can push these financially strapped families over the edge. Page 13 of this annual report highlights the ALICE statistics for Hancock County.

Through the first nine months of 2017 we worked with the data we gathered over the past several years including our Community Conversations of 2017. We met with our partner agencies to discuss the results and ultimately launched our Financial Stability Initiative in October 2017. The intent is to dedicate some United Way funding to initiatives that will address root causes.

We reached out to partner agencies and other community stakeholders involved in the many facets of financial stability, ranging from workforce development to transportation, housing and early childhood education. Many submitted letters of intent to move this process forward. We found the need to improve the tools needed to achieve our goals. Consequently, we turned down the letters of intent while offering to continue funding those programs impacted through 2018. We are now revisiting the processes for implementation coming up with a better plan while continuing the dialogue so that we create the best system possible.

By using these important data points, and because of our generous community, we can transform our community. We are truly on the path to becoming proactive instead of reactive. It takes a combination of these efforts to affect change. We realize that change is challenging and we are doing our best to be flexible, informed and systematic about the change we need to see.


FROM OUR BOARD CHAIR

LICHTINGER SELECTED AS SECOR SCHOLAR

United Way of Hancock County's Secor scholarship committee has announced the selection of Matthew Lichtinger, a senior at Findlay High School, as this year's United Way Foundation Secor Scholar. The \$2,000 renewable Secor Scholarship was established as a memorial to the Steven and Doris Secor bequest. It is awarded to a high school senior or high school graduate living in Findlay or Hancock County who plans to attend an accredited institution of higher learning to pursue an undergraduate field of study, full time in the subsequent academic year. The candidate must exhibit a strong commitment to service, volunteering, extracurricular involvement and academic excellence.

Lichtinger, the son of Michele and Vince Lichtinger, was selected because of his volunteerism, academic accomplishments, involvement in extracurricular and school activities and his ability to exemplify leadership skills.

Jenny Coulter, a guidance counselor at Findlay High School, said, "Matthew is the definition of responsible. Throughout his time at Findlay High School, Matthew has balanced his time with intentional, rigorous coursework as well as a variety of extracurricular organizations and leadership roles. Within each of the challenging courses Matthew has selected, he has earned the highest possible grade. Additionally, Matthew balances his time as the National Honor Society President (leading approximately 75 seniors and 88 new inductees). He is also secretary of Junior Statesmen of America, a captain of the varsity football team, a Findlay First Edition choral member, president of the Red Cross Youth Council and a leader within the St. Michael's Youth group. In each of these organizations, Matthew actively shows the utmost integrity for himself and the organization as well as a strong sense of responsibility, accountability, and leadership."

Lichtinger's service oriented involvement additionally includes volunteering with Key Club, Backyard Mission Trip, Christian Clearinghouse, Wilson Vance Right to Read Week and Coats for Christmas.

In his Secor application, Lichtinger wrote of a mission trip to Belize, "We had come down to help them, to teach them...but they were trying to help us. They were a caliber of people I only hope to be someday."



2017 NONPROFIT LEADER OF THE YEAR



United Way of Hancock County has awarded the Nonprofit Leader Award since 2015. It is presented during the Chamber of Commerce's Small Business Awards ceremony. Nominations are taken from the community and a committee from the Chamber of Commerce reviews and selects an individual who best represents the nonprofit community in leadership, dedication to their respective field, community collaboration and vision.

This year the award was presented to Carol Metzger, CEO of Cancer Patient Services. Metzger has been in this position for six years. She has grown the organization from one full-time employee and one part-time employee to four full-time employees and has increased the budget by 125%. She has secured more than \$1 million in grant funding. She was recognized for her compassionate, enthusiastic and innovative spirit while helping individuals in Hancock deal with a cancer diagnosis. Metzger has increased programming while fostering partnerships with community organizations like Children's Mentoring Connection and Awakening Minds Art.

Under her leadership, Cancer Patient Services received the Ohio Association of Nonprofit Organizations Standards of Excellence Award. She and her staff offer unwavering support and encouragement to cancer patients and their family members.

JONES AND DOYLE SELECTED AS DISTINGUISHED VOLUNTEERS

United Way of Hancock County has selected Karen Jones and William Doyle as this year's recipients of the Jeri Bjorling Memorial Distinguished Volunteer Award. It is the first time the organization has selected two recipients.

"Karen and Bill have worked diligently on United Way of Hancock County's transformation to Collective Impact, a proven, more effective framework to solve complex social issues through the collaborative efforts of several partnerships. They have been instrumental in guiding us toward a process that allows us to get to the root causes of the critical issues in our county. Our journey has benefited greatly from their leadership, project management skills and insight. We would not be where we are today in the collective impact process without their leadership," said John Urbanski, president and chief executive officer of United Way.

Jones has been a registered nurse for 52 years in the Findlay community.

The majority of her career has been at the Blanchard Valley Health System with a focus on emergency services. After 25 years as a certified emergency staff nurse, she served as the director of emergency services from 1990-2006. With the completion of the new hospital pavilion in 2007, Jones advanced to the position of vice president of patient care services/chief nursing executive until

her retirement in January 2011.

She has actively volunteered for many years serving as a board member for United Way of Hancock County, Century Health, Hancock County Health Board, and the newly formed Hancock Public Health Board. At United Way, she has been a long-time member and co-chair of the community solutions committee. She recently joined the Blanchard Valley Health Foundation Board and serves as the grants committee chair for that board.

Other volunteer activities include Cub Scout den leader, solicitor for the American Cancer Society, co-chairman for a local St. Jude's Bike-A-Thon, and a Hancock County 4-H Health Bowl Coach for a team that went to state competition two years in a row. As a parent volunteer at Liberty-Benton School, she assisted in the learning disabilities reading classes, taught sex education classes for 4th and 5th grade, implemented a fluoride health protection program, and was a parent coordinator for Project Happy (youth anti-drug program), liaison chairman for AFS (foreign exchange student program), and a Parent/Teacher Organization officer.

Other community and professional volunteer service include: participating in the Hope House Homeless Shelter strategic planning team, reorganization committee for a combined health district, Blanchard Valley Health System auxiliary volunteer, Ohio Northern University nursing education advisory committee, community bioterrorism and domestic violence, and child abuse/neglect task forces, community critical stress debriefing team, University of Findlay physician assistant program task force, injury surveillance committee, and chair of the United Way health division campaign.



Doyle is an assistant professor of environmental safety and health management at the University of Findlay. Courses he teaches include: project management, business continuity, organizational theory and behavior, public policy and communication and more.



Prior to his teaching career he was employed at Marathon Petroleum Corporation since 1981. He was also previously employed with the United States Army Corps of Engineers where he received the Bronze Star medal for meritorious service in Vietnam and an Army Commendation medal for his role in disaster relief efforts following Hurricane Agnes in the Washington, D.C. and northern Virginia areas.

His past United Way volunteer experience includes: collective impact strategic planning committee, collective impact ad hoc committee, community solutions committee, Halt Hunger Initiative advisory board, health impact team chair, health impact team assistant chair, and health impact team member.

He has extensive volunteer service with the City of Findlay including being: a member of the Storm Water Advisory Committee, representative to the operating committee of the Northwest Ohio Flood Mitigation, LLC, Findlay brown fields advisory committee member, Findlay visioning committee member, Board of Zoning Appeals member and a member of the Hancock Regional Planning Commission. He has also served as a board member for the Findlay-Hancock County Public Library, board member for Habitat for Humanity and United Way health panel liaison for Cancer Patient Services.

Doyle has his Doctor of Philosophy (Ph.D.) in civil engineering from the University of Alabama, a Master of Science (M.S.) in civil engineering from the University of Alabama and a Bachelor of Science (B.S.) in fire protection engineering from the University of Maryland.

2017 COMMUNITY PARTNER AWARD



The Community Partner award is presented annually to the small business or organization that exemplifies a supportive, collaborative relationship with not only United Way, but the community, to measurably improve people's lives. In 2017, we honored HHWP Community Action Commission.

On July 14, 2017 the Blanchard River crested at 16.53 feet, the 5th worst flood in Findlay's history. Calls for assistance began coming into our office almost immediately, and continued for weeks. The needs of the community were staggering, and urgent.

For us to provide help to flood victims in a timely manner, we enlisted the help of another agency. This agency sent social workers to the homes of flood victims to help assess their needs. They helped determine who needed furniture, furnaces, hot water heaters, home and structural repairs. With their involvement we were able to triage the needs and get help to the families as soon as possible. The information was provided back to our office quickly; we were able to disburse the proper funds and coordinate with other organizations to meet the needs of the flood victims.

As a direct result of the efficient work by this agency, we were able to help over 60 families with financial assistance and coordinate volunteers to do the clean-up work in over 200 homes. We helped the elderly woman with peripheral artery disease get a new recliner, the family whose basement wall caved in, and so many folks in between. We could not have reached as many people as we did without their help.

FINANCIAL STABILITY INITIATIVE

In October of 2017, United Way of Hancock County unveiled the Financial Stability Initiative. Through years of strategic planning, studies, community mapping, community assessments and two rounds of community conversations the main issues that have consistently risen to the top are housing, transportation and substance use.

As we researched further into the causes of these issues, financial stability became the overarching factor that could have a positive impact on these issues. We announced three strategies that will guide our Financial Stability work: workforce readiness, financial empowerment and youth investment.

United Way has committed \$5 million over the next 5 years to address the issues surrounding financial stability in Hancock County. The areas of focus will be workforce readiness, financial empowerment and youth investment.

GRANTS AWARDED IN 2017

A full listing of grants provided out of funds raised by the 2017 United Way campaign is as follows:

Boy Scouts of America, Black Swamp Council was awarded \$50,000 for two programs: Exploring, which exposes youth to career opportunities and prepares them to make ethical and moral choices over their lifetimes; and Boy Scouting programs which promote positive youth development and has a lasting impact on youth into young adulthood and throughout their life. A memorandum of understanding of up to \$5,000 has been created to reimburse the organization for assisting boys who want to participate in Boy Scouts but do not have the financial resources to do so. An additional memorandum of understanding of up to \$5,000 is also in place for the Lions program, a pilot program for 5-year old Kindergarten boys.

Camp Fire of Northwest Ohio was awarded \$50,000 for their Thrive program, a research-based, measurable approach to youth development.

Cancer Patient Services was awarded \$150,000 for its Patient Direct Services program providing medical supplies, nutritional supplements, emotional support, education and healing arts programs to cancer patients.

CASA/GAL of Hancock County was awarded \$120,000 for its advocacy program which recruits, trains and supports volunteer Court Appointed Special Advocates as they represent children who are abused, neglected or dependent or are involved in domestic relations disputes.

The Center for Safe and Healthy Children was awarded \$26,000 for their forensic interview and examination program for abused children. The program provides a safe and caring place for use by professionals who investigate child abuse allegations and guide these children and their families through the legal and healing process in the least traumatic way.

Century Health was awarded \$61,641 for its Peer-to-Peer program, a recovery focused direct service provided by Peer Support Specialists trained to advocate and support others struggling with mental illness and addiction recovery.

Challenged Champions Equestrian Center was awarded \$28,000 for its therapeutic riding program supporting residents of Hancock County with special needs, from early childhood to adulthood, and veterans with post-traumatic stress disorder through horseback riding and other horse-related activities that promote physical, emotional and mental developments.

Children's Mentoring Connection was awarded \$113,874 for its Mentoring Youth at Risk program which recruits and screens adult volunteers to serve as mentors to children. Mentoring services are provided through traditional one-on-one, couple and family mentoring as well as community and school-based mentoring.

Findlay Family YMCA was awarded \$50,000 for the Open Door Membership program which makes services accessible to low-income families while still requiring a financial contribution, allowing the family to take ownership and regard themselves as a contributing member to the YMCA and community. A memorandum of understanding of up to \$41,000 has been created to reimburse the organization for the child care program which assists low-income families with child care expenses and provides opportunities for educational, social and physical development.

Family Resource Center was awarded \$131,000 for three programs: Bright Beginnings which focuses on early childhood programming; Community Prevention youth programming which focuses on tobacco, substance and alcohol abuse prevention; and Hancock Addiction Prevention Program for Youth (HAPPY), a peer-to-peer prevention program.

Findlay Hope House for the Homeless was awarded \$265,000 for four programs: the Housing Office, providing housing assistance and community referrals to low-income people; Independence Project which moves homeless families into permanent, affordable housing and out of poverty; Hope House Shelter, providing transitional housing to women and women with children; and the Getting Ahead program, a workshop providing those in poverty with resources to build a more prosperous life for themselves, their families and their communities.

Girl Scouts of Western Ohio was awarded \$47,000 for the Personal and Professional Development program which promotes girls' personal growth and leadership development through a coordinated, progressive series of activities and experiences that help them become socially, morally, emotionally, physically and cognitively competent. In addition, a memorandum of

understanding of up to \$10,000 has been created to reimburse the organization for girls in need who want to participate in Girl Scouts but do not have the financial resources to do so.

HHWP Community Action Commission was awarded \$244,796 for Hancock Area Transportation Services (HATS), a public transportation program. HATS provides individual and contracted transportation allowing Hancock County residents to maintain their independence.

Kidney Foundation of Northwest Ohio was awarded \$9,000 for the Patient Direct Services and Education program in Hancock County.

Open Arms Domestic Violence & Rape Crisis Services was awarded \$305,000 for three programs: Adult Services, providing immediate shelter for persons fleeing from violence; Child Services which includes screening for abuse, conducting support groups for children and providing supervised visits; and Violence Recovery, a program for offenders focused on taking responsibility and changing behavior.

In addition to the above grants, a memorandum of understanding has been entered into with the American Red Cross to reimburse services related to disaster relief and armed forces communications up to \$37,500 for the year.

Investor's choice dollars totaled \$223,988 this year. Designations to other United Ways totaled \$120,206.

The board also earmarked \$200,000 for the Halt Hunger Initiative, which provides funding for local food pantries and programs addressing food insecurity.

Funds have also been earmarked for the community's collective impact work, including the following projects: workforce coalition's Raise the Bar-Hancock County director at \$30,000; Hancock County prekindergarten scholarships at \$145,000; Leader in Me at \$53,000 and a community assessment at \$5,000.

Also, \$188,388 has been placed in restricted reserves for initiative programs not yet finalized. Additional funds raised cover pledges that are uncollectable, board reserves and operating costs

OUR IMPACT TEAM MEMBERS

The dollars raised during the annual fundraising efforts are distributed to approved programs and services through grant requests. The task of reviewing the grants is undertaken by local citizens who serve on the volunteer impact teams during the 2017 grant cycle. Thank you for the many hours you have given to this important undertaking.

UNITED WAY AGRICULTURAL LEADERSHIP AWARD

United Way of Hancock County has awarded its first-ever Agricultural Leadership Award to Mitch Welty, grain manager at Legacy Farmers Cooperative. The award was presented on March 15 at the 29th annual Farmer's Share Breakfast, held by the Chamber of Commerce's agribusiness committee.

United Way is often recognized as a fundraiser, but we also convene stakeholders across sectors of the community to address the most pressing local issues. In 2011, the issue of hunger rose to the top. At that time, roughly 13,000 individuals were identified as food insecure and in response to this information the Halt Hunger Initiative and its advisory board were formed.

To ensure all sectors of the community were represented, Welty, a rural stakeholder, was invited to the table. Under his leadership, the advisory board proposed an opportunity that would showcase the hard work and dedication of 4-H and Future Farmers of America members who raise livestock from infancy to market weight. Their livestock was matched with the need for protein-based food products at local food pantries. Welty's vision has been up and running since 2014.

This program is unique, original, timely and invaluable to our community. It could not have happened without the vision, hard work and advocacy of Mitch Welty to make it all come together.

LIVESTOCK FUND

Sponsorships from individuals and corporations provide funds for the purchase of locally-raised livestock at the Hancock County Fair's Jr. Livestock Auction. These dollars also pay for the processing and distribution of fresh meat to local food pantries. In 2017, 4,138 pounds of locally-raised, quality meat was distributed to seven food pantries county-wide. 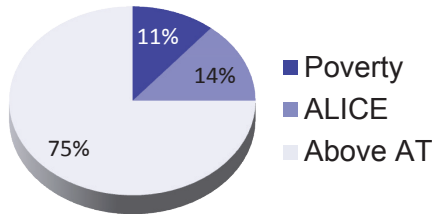
