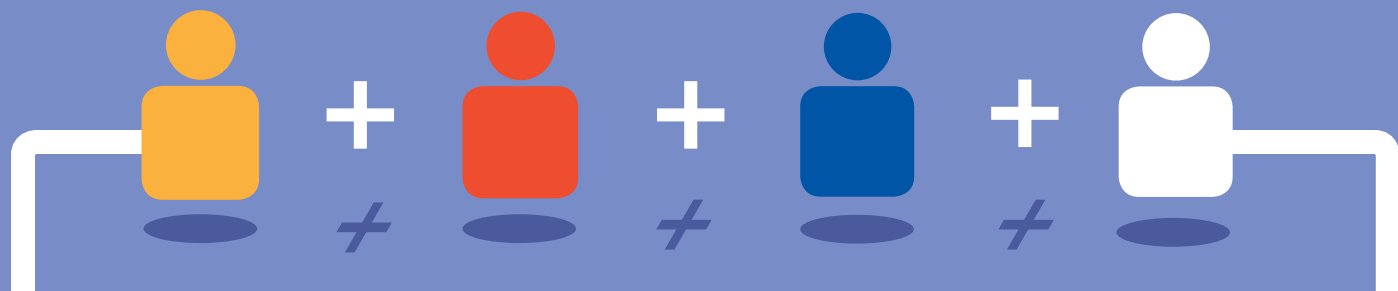

FROM THE CEO



Welcome to our 2015 annual report of activities for United Way of Hancock County. It has been a year filled with promise and progress as we work to assist the community in the process of collective impact.

Last year we discussed our initial steps to address community issues at the root cause by embracing a collaborative, collective process with multiple community partners. I am happy to report that we have many organizations learning about and participating in the process. The private, public and nonprofit sectors are working closely to address the issues identified last year which include: workforce development/financial stability, mental health/substance abuse, literacy/early childhood development, housing, abuse/safety, food insecurity and transportation. We will continue to reach out to the community stakeholders in these areas and others to make sure we are addressing the will and needs of our residents.

Two great examples of our collaborative efforts are in workforce development and early childhood development. United Way has partnered with the City of Findlay, Hancock County Commissioners, Economic Development and the Community Foundation to fund a director for workforce development, now named Raise the Bar Hancock County. The goal of this organization is to develop a sustainable workforce from immediate needs to a grassroots long-term cradle-to-career process. This win/win scenario assists our local businesses in finding permanent employees while also addressing the financial stability of our workforce who are unemployed or underemployed. Collectively, we are working towards a solution.

The other example addresses both workforce development and early childhood development. The Community Foundation and United Way have teamed up to help provide a pre-kindergarten education to underserved children in Findlay and Hancock County public schools. This is part of our “cradle to career” initiative which begins at infancy and culminates in providing opportunities for a sustainable lifestyle for all who live in Findlay and Hancock County. We are already showing great success with this early childhood intervention. One of the many byproducts of this collaboration with the schools will be a reduction in remedial education down the road and it is measurable!

Many coalitions are addressing the needs noted above and are beginning the walk down the path of collective impact. They are at various stages of development. Once again, an exciting opportunity has evolved as we have addressed the needs of these coalitions. Marathon Petroleum Corporation, Cooper Tire and Rubber and The University of Findlay have agreed to provide people skilled in process development and continuous improvement to help facilitate these coalitions as they work collectively. We have a number of other skilled volunteers who are assisting in this process, also. The University of Findlay has recently created the Center for Civic Engagement, a pilot program which will address community needs in the process of collective impact by being a backbone organization to help facilitate the many needs of coalition building. Much more will follow over the upcoming months.

None of these efforts would be possible without the collective YOU. This includes our donors, volunteers, partner agencies and collective partners in Findlay and Hancock County. Thank you for entrusting United Way of Hancock County to play a role in “measurably improving people’s lives in Hancock County.”

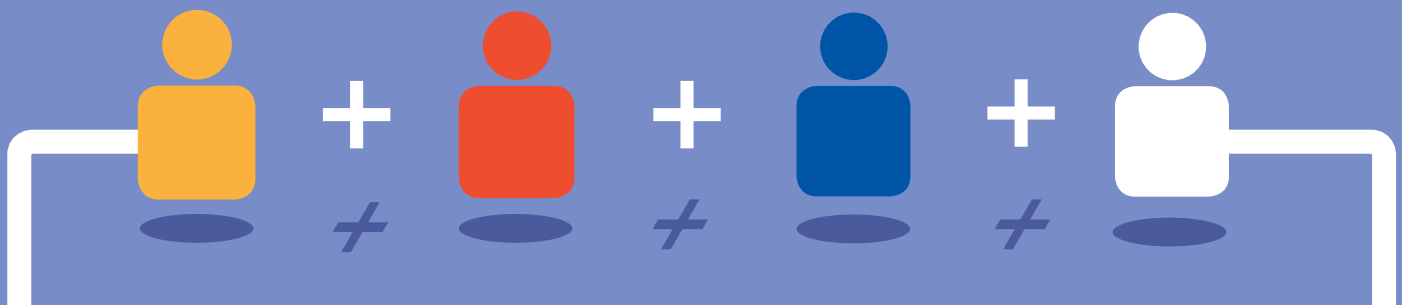

SCHROEDER NAMED 2016 SECOR SCHOLAR



United Way of Hancock County's Secor scholarship committee has announced the selection of Alisha Schroeder, a senior at Findlay High School, as this year's United Way Foundation Secor Scholar. The \$2,000 renewable Secor Scholarship was established as a memorial to the Steven and Doris Secor bequest. It is awarded to a high school senior or high school graduate living in Findlay or Hancock County who plans to attend an accredited institution of higher learning to pursue an undergraduate field of study, full time in the subsequent academic year. The candidate must exhibit a strong commitment to service, volunteering, extracurricular involvement and academic excellence.

Schroeder, the daughter of Ken and Peg Schroeder, was selected because of her volunteerism, academic accomplishments, involvement in extracurricular and school activities and her ability to exemplify leadership skills.

"Alisha's patience and gentle demeanor have proven to be exactly what our 'stars' need," said, Cindy Bregel, executive director of Gliding Stars, an adaptive ice skating program for individuals with disabilities. "Over the years, Alisha has embraced diversity and has shown that a friendship with someone with multiple disabilities is worthwhile and to be valued," she said.

Schroeder's service oriented involvement includes volunteering with Gateway Church vacation bible school, Findlay High School's Relay for Life team, Red Cross Youth Council, Gliding Stars, Clothe-A-Child and Race for the Cure. She is a member of the National Honor Society, Findlay High School Dance Team, National Technical Honor Society, BEST Robotics Team, Hancock Youth Leadership and more.

In her Secor application, Schroeder wrote, "each time I give my time and efforts, I always receive twice back. Red Cross has taught me the values of leadership and the significance of helping others. Vacation Bible School showed me the importance of being a role model for the youth. Dance team has exposed me to skills of time management and responsibility and Hancock Youth Leadership has revealed to me how incredible this community truly is." Schroeder will attend The Ohio State University. She intends to study mechanical engineering.

The United Way of Hancock County Foundation is a nonprofit entity established to ensure the permanence of United Way of Hancock County. 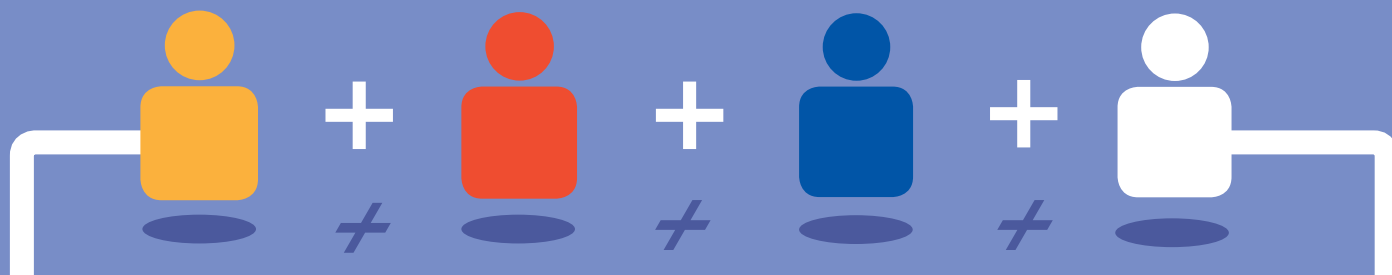

UNITED WAY PROGRAMS AND COLLABORATIONS

Pre-Kindergarten Partnership

The Findlay-Hancock County Community Foundation and United Way of Hancock County are joining forces to ensure that more children have access to pre-kindergarten in Hancock County. In November 2014, United Way board members approved a grant to be awarded in January of 2015 to serve children from low-income families in the Findlay City Schools. The funding allowed for two additional pre-kindergarten classes of 16 children. In May 2015, the Findlay-Hancock County Community Foundation awarded the Hancock County Educational Service Center and Findlay City Schools a one-year grant each to further expand the pre-kindergarten pilot project for children from low-income families. United Way of Hancock County matched the funding for the expansion.

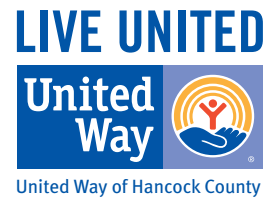
The Hancock County Educational Service Center created a new pre-kindergarten classroom at Riverdale (serving up to 16 students) and offers 20 pre-kindergarten scholarships to students throughout the rest of the county. The intent was to provide equal opportunities to all families for their children to participate in a quality preschool program. These scholarships allow low-income families to send their children to preschool without any cost to the family.

Findlay City Schools created another pre-kindergarten classroom (one morning class and one afternoon class) serving up to 28 students at Washington Preschool. This was in addition to the pre-kindergarten classroom started through United Way funding in January 2015. The grants cover tuition, transportation and lunch to the pre-kindergarten students.

The Findlay-Hancock County Community Foundation provided grants totaling \$179,000 that were awarded as follows: \$35,016 to the Hancock County Educational Service Center; and \$143,984 to the Findlay City Schools.

United Way of Hancock County provided grants totaling \$159,000 that were awarded as follows: \$35,016 to the Hancock County Educational Service Center; and \$123,984 to Findlay City Schools.

In a few short months, the United Way funded program was showing results. Pre-kindergarten teachers were already seeing improvements in kindergarten readiness skills including dramatic increases in language skills, math skills and socialization. The pilot pre-kindergarten class began in January, 2015 with five students only naming 0-5 pictures in one minute. By April, seventeen students could name 21+ pictures. The typical peer class (not economically disadvantaged) began with zero children naming 0-5 pictures and four students in the 11-20 picture range. Twenty-eight out of thirty students named 21+ pictures in April. The data clearly indicates that students that are not economically disadvantaged enter school with a more extensive vocabulary. However, students in the pilot class showed significant growth in less than a four month time frame. The pilot class also showed impressive gains in their math concepts. Eleven of twenty-one students mastered 16-20 items on the math assessment in April, which is an improvement from four students in January. Similar to the language assessment, the typical peer group entered pre-kindergarten with a greater knowledge of math concepts.



Collective Impact Summit

A number of local organizations, including United Way of Hancock County, coordinated a Collective Impact Summit on Wednesday, August 26, 2015 at Winebrenner Seminary. The event was a facilitated interactive dialogue about the Findlay/Hancock County journey to becoming a community that addresses root causes of our most pressing issues through collective and collaborative processes. This event was open to the public. The keynote speaker was Jack Hess, Executive Director for the Institute for Coalition Building out of Columbus, Indiana.

Special Needs Day


In 2015, with the cooperation of the Boy Scouts, Black Swamp Council and United Way of Hancock County, more than 274 special needs children from area schools participated in this fun and educational interactive event. An average of 25 volunteers per year from local businesses take the day to support and assist with camping activities like fishing, canoeing, archery and more.



Days of Caring 2015

United Way of Hancock County coordinated the annual Days of Caring event from April 27 to May 1, 2015. Each year, United Way recruits teams of volunteers from local businesses and companies to contribute four hours a day helping local nonprofit organizations with projects they may not otherwise be able to complete. The 2015 Days of Caring resulted in 1,075 volunteers completing 375 projects for 30 local organizations. The volunteers worked a total of 4,300 hours, providing nonprofit organizations in Hancock County with labor worth \$92,278. The dollar figure is based on the most recent Ohio volunteer hourly dollar value of \$21.46 per hour. The dollar amount is provided by Independent Sector, the leadership network for nonprofits, foundations, and corporations committed to advancing the common good.

Ohio Benefit Bank and VITA

United Way welcomed The Ohio Benefit Bank (OBB) to Findlay eight years ago. The OBB connects citizens to programs and resources that can stabilize a household, and benefit our community as a whole. The tax assistance program included The OBB free tax clinics as well as our joint venture with the VITA (volunteers in tax assistance/IRS) and the use of 2-1-1 as the scheduling agent. The funds received by the tax clinic participants go right back into our local economy.

This program also saves low-to middle-income families thousands of dollars by not having to pay for their income tax preparation.

During the 2015-16 tax season, 2,991 federal tax returns were filed through the free tax preparation program. The total amount of federal refunds processed through the program was \$ 2,113,247. Of that amount, \$695,228 was returned to families in Earned Income Tax Credits (EITC) and child credit. With an average tax preparation fee of \$250, the free tax preparation clinics in Hancock County saved tax filers approximately \$747,750 in preparation fees. Free tax preparation services were for individuals who made up to \$65,000 and families who made up to \$96,000 in 2015. Again this year, appointments were scheduled through United Way of Hancock County's 2-1-1 resource and referral call center.

FamilyWize Prescription Cards

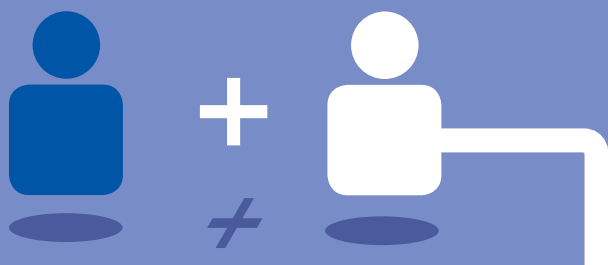
FamilyWize essentially acts like a huge consumer group buying service for the uninsured and underinsured. The discounts and savings on medications are provided voluntarily by the more than 61,000 participating pharmacies nationwide. In 2015, these cards saved Hancock County residents \$36,201. The cards are available in many ways. Pick one up at the United Way office as well as many social service organizations in the county. The card is available by texting the word "family" to 700700. It can also be downloaded on a smartphone as an app from iTunes or Google Play.



Dial 2-1-1

2-1-1 continues to be a valuable resource in the community. Our partnership continues with United Way of Greater Toledo to provide the 2-1-1 service by phone, email and on the web at <http://www.referweb.net/211toledo/>. 2015 GRANTS

Boy Scouts of America, Black Swamp Council was awarded \$45,000 two programs: Boy Scouting program which promotes positive youth development that has a lasting impact on youth into young adulthood and throughout their life; and Exploring which includes preparing young people to make ethical and moral choices over their lifetimes and exploring career opportunities.

Camp Fire of Northwest Ohio was awarded \$124,000 for two programs: the Camp Fire Contributes-Self Reliance program which includes teaching young people how to handle themselves in unsafe situations and how to be of service to their community; and the Camp Fire Connects-Outreach program which builds caring, confident youth and future leaders.

Cancer Patient Services was awarded \$120,000 for its Patient Support program providing medical supplies, nutritional supplements, emotional support and education to cancer patients.

CASA/GAL of Hancock County was awarded \$120,000 for its advocacy program which recruits, trains and supports volunteer Court Appointed Special Advocates as they represent children who are abused, neglected or dependent or are involved in domestic relations disputes.

Century Health was awarded \$51,829 for its Peer-to-Peer program, a recovery focused direct service provided by Peer Support Specialists trained to advocate and support others struggling with mental illness and addiction recovery. Century Health also received an additional one-time grant from United Way board reserves of \$12,500 to assist with the purchase of a van to transport residents of Tree Line Recovery Center to activities in the community.

Challenged Champions Equestrian Center was awarded \$28,000 for its therapeutic riding program supporting residents of Hancock County with special needs, from early childhood to adulthood, and veterans through horseback riding and other horse related activities that promote physical, emotional and mental developments.

Children's Mentoring Connection was awarded \$96,300 for its Mentoring Youth at Risk program which recruits and screens adult volunteers to serve as mentors to children.

Findlay Family YMCA was awarded \$91,000 for two programs: the Open Door Membership program which makes services accessible to low-income families while still requiring a financial contribution, allowing the family to take ownership and regard themselves as a contributing member to the YMCA and community; and the child care program which provides educational, social and physical development while also assisting low-income families with child care expenses.

Family Resource Center was awarded \$131,490 for three programs: Bright Beginnings which focuses on early childhood programming; Community Prevention which focuses on tobacco and alcohol abuse prevention; and Hancock Addiction Prevention Program for Youth (HAPPY), a peer-to-peer prevention program.

Findlay Hope House for the Homeless was awarded \$285,000 for four programs: the Housing Office, providing housing assistance and community referrals to low-income people; Independence Project provides six months of rental assistance and case management to homeless families or single adults; Hope House Shelter, providing transitional housing to women and women with children in a nine bedroom shelter for up to nine months; and Bridges Out of Poverty, a multi-faceted initiative focused on assisting people in generational poverty to be prosperous and communities to remain sustainable.

Girl Scouts of Western Ohio was awarded \$57,000 for the Personal and Professional Development program which promotes girls' personal growth and leadership development through a coordinated, progressive series of activities and experiences that help them become socially, morally, emotionally, physically and cognitively competent.

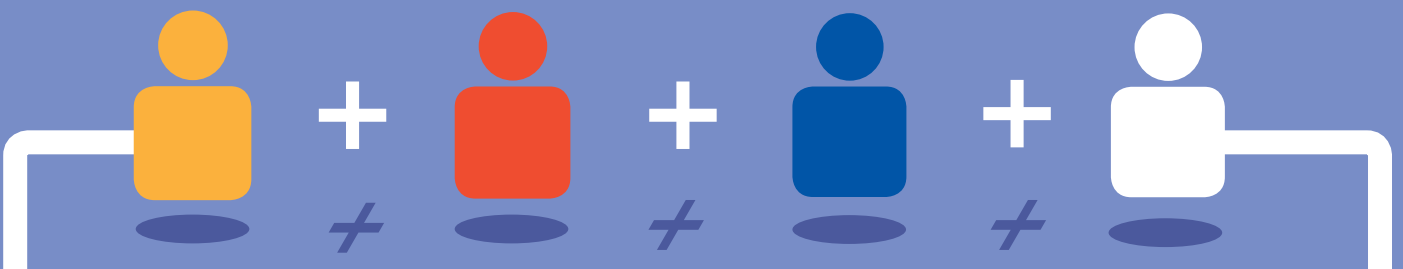
Hancock County Saves was awarded \$27,500 to provide programs to promote and increase saving and debt reduction to produce financial stability among individuals and families through education and awareness.

HHWP Community Action Commission was awarded \$255,000 for Hancock Area Transportation Services (HATS), a public transportation program taking people to work, health appointments and more.

Kidney Foundation of Northwest Ohio was awarded \$9,000 for the Patient Direct Services and Education program in Hancock County.

Open Arms Domestic Violence & Rape Crisis Services was awarded \$305,000 for three programs: Adult Services, providing immediate shelter for persons fleeing from violence; Child Services which includes screening for abuse, conducting support groups for children and providing supervised visits; and Violence Recovery, a program for offenders focused on taking responsibility and changing behavior.

In addition to these grants, a memorandum of understanding has been entered into with the **American Red Cross** to reimburse services related to disaster relief and armed forces communications up to \$50,000 for the year.

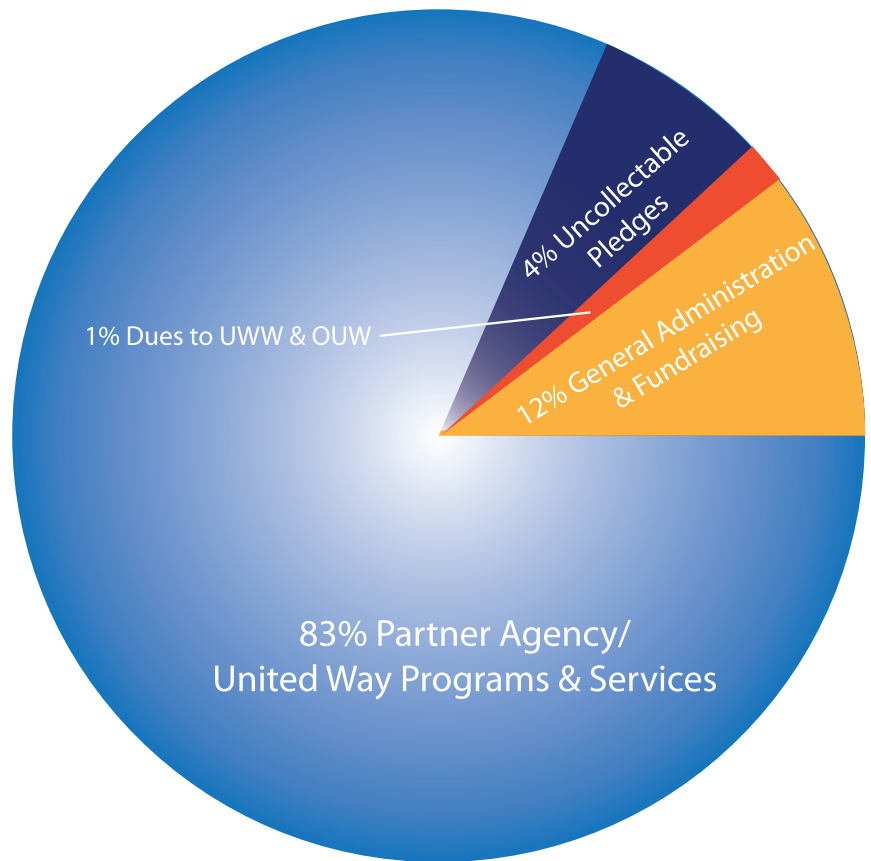

HALT HUNGER INITIATIVE

ADVISORY BOARD



The United Way of Hancock County board of directors approved six Halt Hunger Initiative grants during the monthly board meeting on Thursday,

November 19, 2015. The amount granted from the Halt Hunger Initiative totaled \$222,500.

Recognizing that a cancer diagnosis often creates unexpected expenses in the home and that optimum nutrition is vital to their recovery process, **Cancer Patient Services** received \$22,000 for its nutritional supplement program. Individuals with a cancer diagnosis or in treatment are able to acquire free nutritional supplements in the forms of drinks or pudding.

Christian Clearing House received \$50,000 for its Caring Cupboard program. This program provides food vouchers four times a year for needy families or individuals who qualify for the help.

Lutheran Social Services of Findlay received \$5,000 for their Emergency Food Pantry. Lutheran Social Services has relocated from Lima Avenue to 1701 Tiffin Ave. inside St. John's Lutheran Church. This food pantry has stopped issuing food boxes and now offers a choice food pantry option.

Ohio State Extension received \$10,500 of continued support of the program coordinator position.

Salvation Army received \$65,000 for its Emergency Food Pantry.

West Ohio Food Bank received \$70,000 for its food distribution program that serves local member charities such as CHOPIN Hall, Lutheran Social Services, Salvation Army and other pantries in the Hancock County area by providing deeply discounted food.

ON THE BALL TO BETTER HEALTH

With funding from the Halt Hunger Initiative, United Way was able to present a pilot program called "On the Ball to Better Health" to Lincoln Elementary's fourth grade class. This six-week exercise and nutrition program is designed to educate students to recognize healthful food choices, appropriate portion size and to encourage after-school exercise with the use of a 55cm exercise ball.

Each student received an "On the Ball to Better Health" kit. This kit contained a 55cm exercise ball to take home, an exercise journal, a nutrition journal and a food portion magnet. Nutrition and exercise journals are being completed by each participating student and verified by a parent or caregiver and teacher. Bi-weekly incentives are being offered to students who complete both the exercise journal and the nutrition journals. These incentives include a water bottle, yo-yo and pedometer.

Students will write an essay at the end of the six-week session about their On the Ball experience and submit this paper for judging. Judges will be from United Way of Hancock County, Hancock Public Health, Ohio State Extension and XT Fitness.

For those students who complete all six weeks of the program and submit their essay, they will be in the running for one of the following grand prizes: First place - four passes to Castaway Bay; Second place - \$50 gift certificate to Dick's Sporting Goods; Third place - \$25

gift certificate to Shady Grove Miniature Golf. United Way of Hancock County is eager to see the results in 2016.



WATCH ME LIVE UNITED



United Way of Hancock County celebrated its 60th anniversary by producing a music video. We put together a parody of the song "Watch Me" by Silento which features dances called "Whip It Nae Nae," "Bop" and the "Stanky Leg."

We wanted to involve the community in a video that could provide great exposure and encourage citizens of Hancock County to help us measurably improve people's lives.

We asked the community to gather friends and co-workers and submit videos of themselves dancing to the summer sensation. We also invited local adults and youth to participate in a video shoot on August 10, 2015. More than 100 people showed up and many stayed for 4 hours.

Local resident Rich Kramer recorded the song and led the video. Community Partner Award

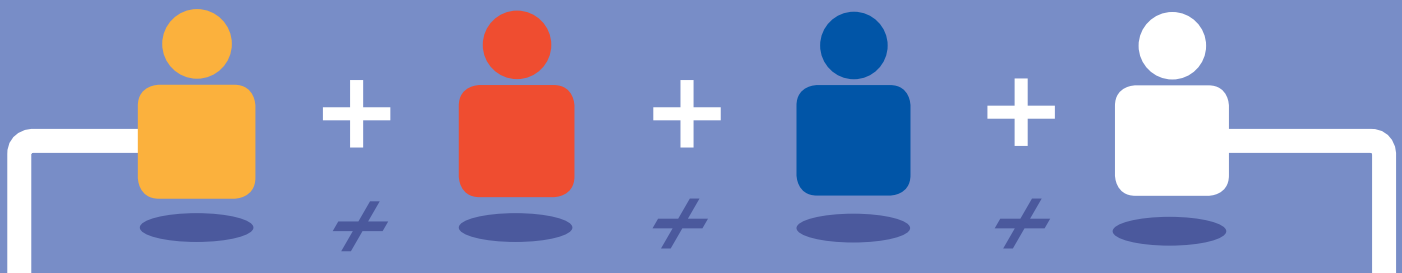

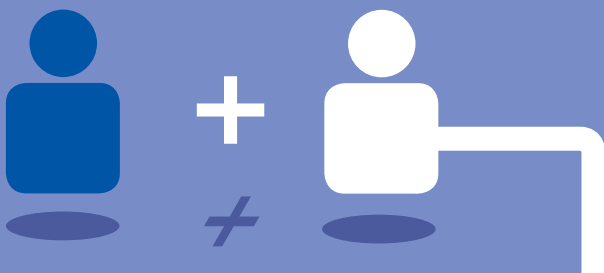
